

History of the Iowa Tuition Grant

2019 marked the 50-year anniversary of the Iowa Tuition Grant (ITG) program, one of the most successful education initiatives ever enacted by the Iowa Legislature.

Iowa Tuition Grant Statistics

- \$6,000 annual maximum grant per student
- \$47.7 million: state annual appropriation for Iowa Tuition Grant
- \$500 million+: annual institutional financial aid by non-profit colleges and universities
- 10,000+: number of ITG recipients each year
- 500,000+: number of ITG grants made to Iowans since 1969
- 20: median age of ITG recipient
- 29%; percentage of non-traditional-age ITG recipients (22 years and above)
- \$57,219: median income of recipient families
- 66.15%: percentage of ITG recipients also eligible for federal Pell grant

Iowa Workforce Challenges

- Iowa has one of the lowest unemployment rates in the nation.
- The tight job market is creating challenges in filling open positions.
- Employers are seeking skills many job seekers don't have.

How can Iowa's private colleges & universities help?

- Twenty-five campuses across the state for local companies. Critical for place-bound students.
- Flexible classes part-time classes could be incorporated into a full- or part-time employee's schedule.
- The expansion of the ITG requirements means more students qualify. Adult learners are also eligible.
- There are additional financial assistance options available for employees.
